

REPOSITORY OF INTERNATIONAL ACTS OF THE BRAZILIAN GOVERNMENT

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs manages a platform with records of international agreements concluded by the Brazilian State. Learn more about "Concórdia" and how to use this important treaty search tool.



The Concórdia platform – https://concordia.itamaraty.gov.br – is a tool developed by the Division of International Acts and the Information Technology Division of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs for consulting international acts to which Brazil is a party.





With the platform, it is possible to carry out research on international acts to which Brazil is a party, as well as verify their texts, in all the languages in which they were originally signed.

The acts are organized in a tabular form, with the following attributes of each document being informed: title of the agreement, other party, subject, date of execution, status of the processing and the type of agreement.

It currently has 12088 registered acts, dating from 1822.



The Concordia system is innovative in the sense of carrying out a systematic information management of the act signed by the Brazilian Government, with the notes of its internalization phase.

As well explained in this repository, the acts may be classified, according to their validity, according to the following phases:





- 1. MRE Proceedings (Tramitação MRE): the act is being processed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- 2. Ministries/Casa Civil Proceedings (Tramitação Ministérios/Casa Civil): the act was approved by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and is being analyzed by other Ministries and/or the Civil House.
- 3. National Congress Proceedings (Tramitação Congresso Nacional): the act was forwarded by the Civil House to the Presidency of the Republic. The Message to Congress was signed by the President and forwarded, along with the Explanatory Memorandum, to the National Congress.
- 4. Ongoing Ratification (Em Ratificação): the act was approved by the National Congress and is in the process of being ratified by the Parties.




- 5. Ongoing Enactment (Em Promulgação): the act has been ratified and the Enactment process (internalization of the act in the domestic legal system through a Presidential Decree) is in progress.
- 6. In force (Em vigor): the act has completed the necessary steps for its entry into force.
- 7. Expired (Expirado): the act is no longer in force due to its expiration.
- 8. Denounced (Denunciado): the act is not in force as a result of denunciation by one of the Parties.
- 9. Special situation (Situação especial): see comments
